**\*\*Inner visions versus outer visions\*\***

- The speaker differentiates between inner visions (seen in the spirit) and outer visions (full-blown, external visions), and the importance of honesty in sharing them.

**\*\*The importance of spiritual hunger\*\***

- The speaker discusses the significance of spiritual hunger and the pursuit of 'more' beyond initial spiritual experiences like salvation and baptism in the Holy Spirit.

**\*\*Feasting at the Lord's table\*\***

- A vision is shared where the speaker is invited to feast at the Lord's table in heaven, symbolizing deeper spiritual communion and revelation.

**\*\*Repentance and forgiveness\*\***

- The speaker shares a moment of repentance and receiving forgiveness from Jesus, emphasizing the freedom and love found in forgiveness.

**\*\*The call to spiritual obedience and sacrifice\*\***

- The teaching concludes with a call to spiritual obedience and sacrifice, choosing to feast at the Lord's table over the table of demons, and the implications of such choices.

13. Why does answering the Lord's call require obedience and sacrifice on our part? What might we need to give up to feast at His table?
14. How can we keep our spiritual hunger sharp and avoid growing complacent in our relationship with God?
15. What does it mean that the Lord will enlarge our capacity to receive more of Him as we diligently seek Him?
16. How can we avoid the trap of just going through religious motions without heart engagement and intimacy with Jesus?
17. Why is it vital that we make the most of the time we have left on earth to passionately pursue God?
18. In what ways can spiritual immaturity and compromise hinder us from going deeper in God and being ready for His return?
19. How does regular meditation on messages like this help with our spiritual growth process? What is the importance of "beholding" Jesus?

1. "When there's a people that will worship him in spirit and in truth, I'm not talking about singing songs. [...] But as we become that new song to the Lord, when we're one with the heart of Jesus, when the bride and the bridegroom become one in heart, we become His new song."
2. "There are sometimes that you'll have a visitation and there'll be other times that you will not have a visitation. Be consistent anyway."
